4 Background Paper (to be debated):

A Paper to be sent to Diocesan Synod with the following Motion that was debated and passed in June 2023:

This Synod requests the Diocesan Synod to debate a motion calling for the General Synod to review how Church of England weddings have changed since the pandemic, and asking for the Government to change the law to allow Church of England ministers to conduct Church of England weddings in places other than church of England registered settings.

There were a range of views regarding this which were discussed. However, the majority were in favour of this motion.

It was noted that we should include varied views regarding this motion. Include more about the discussion and concerns into these different views into the paper to be sent to the Diocesan Synod. It was noted that clarification from both sides of the argument needed to be expressed more.

One main concern being a reduction of church weddings.

Fr Martin and Leslie to include more range to the motion.
